What happens at Presentation Night?

Your child gets a chance to develop their public presentation skills. Depending on their age, they can present from 3 to 15 minutes. In that time they can do a number of different types of presentations such as:

Demonstration

Show how a task is done or a product is made. For example, with a pet hamster in its cage, demonstrate how to take care of the hamster, or using props, show how to make a milkshake.

Illustrated Talk

Present information using pictures, posters, models, etc., not the actual item. For example, use posters to talk about a favorite breed of horse. Also, power points can be shown.

Formal Speech

An original speech or a poem or one written by a well-known person, given from memory.

Performing Arts

Includes dramatics, oral interpretation of literature, dance, musical performance, puppetry, etc.

After the presentation is finished, each presenter is evaluated by volunteer judges against 4-H criteria. The judging is done on the 'Danish' system. This means there are no 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place finishers, but rather they receive ribbons saying "excellent", "very good", or "good" – As many presenters who deserve these rankings will receive their respective ribbons. There is not just one winner, as in other types of events. Any 4-H'er who does not want to be judged may indicate so on the registration form; but will still receive comments on their talk and a participation ribbon.

Members in 3rd grade and younger (Cloverbuds) will participate in the "participation only" category.

How long should my presentation be?

4-H'ers in 3rd grade and younger (Cloverbuds): your presentation can be any length and done as a group. Please discuss this with your leader.

4-H'ers in 4th grade and older, your entire presentation should be:

- **3-5 minutes** (1st time speaking at the county level)
- 5-8 minutes (for those who have previously presented at the county level)
- 8-15 minutes (for those in 8th grade or higher & who are attempting to qualify for NJ State Presentation Day, Saturday, June10, 2023 at Rutgers University in New Brunswick)

How do I prepare?

Pick a topic: When choosing a topic for a presentation, start with something easy that you know and enjoy talking about. It is very

hard to tell people about something that you don't know.

Keep an open mind. You don't have to use your 4-H project as a topic. There are many topics related to what you're already doing in 4-H. Consider a variety of areas and topics. A project at school? A hobby? A sport? Your favorite music?

Gather your information

Organize your information into 3 sections:

The Introduction

Introduce yourself and tell what you are going to do. Tell the audience why they should be interested.

The Body

"Show and Tell", what you are doing, so the audience may learn. Give accurate and complete information. Use charts or pictures big enough for people to see, but keep facing the audience.

The Summary

Remind the audience of your main points. Tell the source of your information. Ask, "Are there any questions?"

You may use notes.

They help you to be able to look at the audience

when you speak.

If you are in the 8th grade or above and you receive an Excellent Ribbon, you will be invited to attend the State Public Presentation Day on Saturday June 8th, 2024, at Rutgers in New Brunswick. You will receive an entry form from the Union County 4-H Office
